First Day, Monday, April 3rd,
1854.

The Board of Commissioners of Island County meets pursuant to law, at Coe Island, on the First Monday, the third day of April, A.D. 1854. Present, John Alexander and John Crockett, Commissioners, R. H. Lundell, County Auditor, acting as Clerk, and Hugh Crockett, Sheriff of Island County.

Allowances to Sheriff.

Ordered by the Board, that Hugh Crockett, Sheriff be and he is hereby allowed out of the county treasury the sum of thirty dollars for hire of boat six days charter to bring an Indian from Sitka to be tried for murder.

Also, the sum of three dollars for boarding one Indian in custody as witness three days.

Also, the sum of twenty ^{dollars} for services as sheriff six days in going for said Indian.

Also, the sum of nine dollars for services as sheriff at February Term, 1854, of District Court of Island County.

The above allowances were made by the District Court of Island County at the February Term of said Court for the year 1854, and the sums of thirty and twenty dollars are paid under process by this board.

Allowances to Sheriff.

Ordered by the Board, that Hugh Crockett, Sheriff of Island County, be allowed out of the county treasury the sum of thirty two dollars & 50 cents for summoning Grand and Petty Jurors for the February Term of the District Court of Island County, for 1854, & six dollars for serving subpoenas for witnesses at said court.

Ordered by the board, that Hugh Crockett Sheriff, be allowed three dollars out of the county treasury for his ~~stay~~ attendance on this board.

Review of Road from Coe Island to E

Now is presented the petition of the King and eleven other residents householders of Island County praying for a review and alteration of public road leading from Coe Island to the Eby's Land claim, and the same having been read, a committee to be named then being no objection made.

This name by the board, that William James, William King, and Jacob Hillman be and they are hereby appointed to view and locate so much of the proposed road from Coe Island to the Eby's Land claim, as lies between the head of (So called) near a point just south of the outlet of the Tiedon basin south of Capt. B. Anderson's house; and to name
