Ordered by the board, that N. R. Basich and he is hereby allowed out of the County Treasury the sum of Five Dollars and a half cents for one table for Clerk's office.

Ordered by the Board, that Nelson R. Basich be and he is hereby allowed out of the County Treasury the sum of two dollars for one attendance at the District Court of Island County Feb. term 1854. (taken on petition)

Ordered by the board, that R. H. Cavada be and he is hereby allowed the sum of five dollars for one case of pigeon holes for the Clerk's office, and a dollar and a half for his accounts up to the date of the present session, and five dollars and ninety cents for his services at the present session of the board.

Ordered, that John Alexander be and he is hereby allowed the sum of three dollars out of the County Treasury for his attendance as a Commissioner at this session, and that John Crockett be allowed three dollars for his services as a Commissioner at this session.
