

Records of the Board of Commissioners of

Revenue for 1854.

Now comes Humphrey Hill, assessor of Island county for 1854, and makes returns of his assessments of persons and property in Island county, and the board having examined and corrected the same it is ordered to be filed and the proper duplicates to be made out: 10 mills is assessed on each hundred dollar of property for territorial purposes; 3 mills for school purposes; and 4 mills for county purposes; and one dollar on each taxable poll.

Compensation to Assessor.

The board having received the account of the assessor for 1854, he is allowed fifty-five dollars out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, being \$5 per day for 11 days so occupied.

Adjournment.

The Board adjourns till Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock.

Revenue for 1854.

It is ordered to be entered of record that the number of taxable polls in Island County is ninety-two, and the amount of taxable property is six hundred and thirty-seven thousand seven hundred and thirty-three dollars, (\$637,733). Tax on pollable Poll Tax \$92 - on property for all purposes - \$509.20.

Settlement with County Treasurer.

Upon settlement with county treasurer the amount paid into the treasury is \$290,40; the amount disbursed \$276,90; treasurer's percentage \$8,54; balance on hand, \$2,96. The county orders paid are cancelled by the board.
