The viewers appointed to view and locate a public road from the N.E. corner of J. St. Ebby's land claim to J. S. Smith's land claim now and to present their report, which is read, and ordered that it be laid out by the next session of this board, according to law.

Compensation to Road Viewers.

R. H. Lonsdale and James Buggy are each allowed three dollars for one day's services in viewing road from Cleveland to Crescent Harbor Thairid; H. Fuller, J. W. Lyle & R. S. Robinson are each allowed two dollars out of the county treasury for one day's services as viewers in a road from J. St. Ebby's claim to J. S. Smith's claim.

Road from Capt. Robertson's to Cleveland.

Now come rights (and many) landholders and owners of Island county and present their petition for a road from Capt. Robertson's to J. St. Ebby's claim and to instruct the road from Ebby's claim, and also petition having been read, and having considered the petition, the board appoints J. B. Crockett, Jno. G. Harris & J. St. Ebby to view and locate a county road from a certain point on Capt. Robertson's land claim, thence to run down to the beach to a given point on J. St. Ebby's land a thence in a westerly & westerly direction and connect with public road from J. St. Ebby's to Cleveland. Said viewers shall meet on the first Monday of October next, and they shall report to the next session of this board.
