Now comes Humphrey Hill, assessor for Island County for 1855, and makes return of his assessment of persons and property in Island County, and the Board having examined, and corrected, the Roll, it is ordered to be filed, and the proper duplicates to be made out: one mill is assessed on each hundred dollars, for Territorial purposes and Two mills for school purposes and four mills for County purposes and one dollar upon each Taxable Poll
