Now is presented the petition  
of James Bughby and fourteen others to wit:  
May 29. 1857

To the Commissioners of Ireland County,  
Walter an disigned citizens & householders of  
Ireland County respectfully petition your honorable  
body to appoint a view to examine & report  
upon the practicability & expediency of a road  
from the residence of Charles Miller at the East  
end of Crescent Station to the Residence of P. D.  
Hend on the parish about one mile west of the  
old residence of Sullivan & Barrington we also  
respectfully petition for leave to open said  
road within one year labour & have a credit  
of all that any way paye may work upon  
said Road (over and above what all  
persons do, or are required to do by the superior)  
given upon his County tax according to the  
current price of labour, and said petition  
having been read according to Law the  
Board object to tax payers being paid  
by the County for any extra work done  
or time spent in working on said Road  
over and above what is done by the Statute  
Labour of which the Law Compells each  
man to give four, but no objection having  
been made to practicability of opening said  
Road It is the order of the Board

of County Commissioners that to wit  
William Miller, James M. Mount and  
Thomas Maylor be and are hereby appointed  
to view and locate said Road as proposed  
for in said petition upon the best and  
most suitable ground and that they or  
a majority of them report to the Board  
at its next regular session in June 1857

Ordered by the Board that Iacob Smith  
Shriff be and he is hereby allowed the sum  
of twelve dollar (12.00) for 14 days attend  
at July term of the District Court out of any  
money remaining in the Treasury not otherwise  
appropriated.

Ordered by the Board that the following  
sums be and they are hereby allowed for money  
remained at July term of District Court  
Jacob Smith as Sheriff in the case of the  
Society of Washing ton against J. J. Sumner 4.25  
John Smith, a witness 2 days 2 miles travel 4.25  
to Barrington 1.00 2.50  
out of any money remaining in the  
Treasury not otherwise appropriated.
